## The LIA's Guide to the latest announcement on RoHS

The EU published its review of RoHS exemptions on mercury containing lamps on 24th February 2022 in <u>the Official Journal of the European Union</u>. Post Brexit, our industry awaited confirmation of the UK timetable, on Monday 30<sup>th</sup> January 2023, DEFRA published the Secretary of State's determination applicable to England, Scotland and Wales on the <u>Government's website</u>. The lamp type exemptions mirror the EU, but with extended implementation timescales as listed below.
